award 2026 in the category ,Bridge‘ (Mediator)**

The ,Carle Honors‘ are annual awards presented by [The Eric Carle Museum of Picture Book Art](#) to recognize individuals and organizations for their creative vision, dedication, and significant impact on children’s picture books and literacy. Established in 2006 on behalf of Eric Carle, these internationally renowned awards honour pioneers in five categories: Artist, Angel (Patron), Bridge (Mediator), Mentor and Inspiration. The winners are selected by a committee chaired by American children's book historian, author and critic Leonard S. Marcus, the founder of the awards. The category ,Bridge‘ honors individuals or organizations who have found inspired ways to bring the art of the picture book to larger audiences through work in other fields.

Jury Statement: „*The International Youth Library (IYL) in Munich, Germany, is the world’s largest library for international children’s and youth literature. Founded in 1949 by Jella Lepman, it has grown to become an internationally recognized literature center. The work of the IYL is guided by the conviction that children’s and young adult books are an essential part of the cultural life of a society and a country, and as such must be preserved, documented, and shared. To bring this mission to life, the IYL runs an annual program of exhibitions, author readings, workshops, panel discussions, and an international literature festival, and offers a fellowship program for foreign researchers that is unique worldwide.*“
